I am specialised in G I surgery (super speciality dept), in a government hospital which fetch me money which i can earn doing one surgery in a corporate hospital.

I am in the govt set basically because of my education in sathya sai institutions.

Only we guys know the value of sacrifice and service in this world driven by capitalism

I am ardent reader of Bangalore Mirror and times of India since the time it was launched in Bangalore, also i was following Mumbai mirrior for two years when i was in Mumbai.

I being big fan of ur news paper, am deeply hurt by the deteriorating quality of news articles which are appearing and i feel they lack research of late. Also we find lack of quality of reporters

He being the son-in-law of former prime minister has nothing to with his professional qualification or his achievements. I would like to highlight few of his achievements which i know by being a doctor.

He is one of the first few qualified DM cardiologists in Bangalore with over more than 20 years of experience in the field of cardiology.

He has published innumerable number of research papers and written books and public awareness articles in the field of cardiology. This has nothing to do with his affiliation to his political family.

He is the pioneer of a technique called "**Baloon valvuloplasty** " and he training the consultants through the world for the same. Earlier procedure used to cost about 2 lakh rupees and this technique will cost only 50000 rupees to the patients and this technique is boon to lot of people across the world.

He regularly demonstrating/teaching the same through live workshops through teleconferencing to the world.

His work is being presented as case study for low cost affordable health care by IIM Bangalore by Dr Phillip or somebody by a similar name (name i am not sure of).

If i am not wrong i read it in Times of India / Deccan herald sometime in june /july a congratulatory message for him from Obama the president of USA.

He has been instrumental in mobilising lot of donations and in organising the heart treatment to the poor

I personally feel especially in this era of corruption and mal administration in the govt institutions you hardly find honest persons and you guys should not demoralise them for filling gaps in your news paper.
